Wikipedia (/ˈwɪkɪˈpiːdiə/ (listen), /ˈwɪkiˈpiːdiə/ (listen) *WIK-ih-PEE-dee-ə*) is a multilingual, web-based, free openly editable content; a *wiki*. It is the largest and most popular general reference work on the *World Wide Web* popular websites by *Alexa* rank.^[6] It is owned and supported by the *Wikimedia Foundation*, a non-profit organization that receives from donors.^[7]^[8]^[9]

Wikipedia was launched on January 15, 2001, by *Jimmy Wales* and *Larry Sanger*.^[10] Sanger coined its name *wiki*^[notes 3] and "encyclopedia". Initially an English-language encyclopedia, versions in other languages were created. ^[notes 4] the English Wikipedia is the largest of the more than 290 Wikipedia encyclopedias. Overall, there are over 6 million articles in 301 different languages^[14] and by February 2014 it had reached 18 billion page views an month.^[15]

In 2005, *Nature* published a peer review comparing 42 science articles from *Encyclopædia Britannica* and found that the level of accuracy approached that of *Britannica*.^[16] *Time* magazine stated that the open-door policy of allowing anyone to edit Wikipedia the biggest and possibly the best encyclopedia in the world and it was testament to the vision of

Wikipedia has been criticized for exhibiting systemic bias, for presenting a mixture of "truths, half truths, or subject to manipulation and spin in controversial topics.^[19] In 2017, Facebook announced that it would help link to Wikipedia articles. YouTube announced a similar plan in 2018. In response, *The Washington Post* wrote "the Internet".^[20]
